Colonel Richard D. Hunt is the Vice Commander of the 175th Wing, Maryland Air National Guard. The 175th Wing has over 1,400 personnel supporting an A-10 Group, a Cyber Operations Group and an Intelligence Squadron. In this role, he is responsible for the combat readiness of 21 A-10C aircraft, the associated aircrew and aircraft maintainers. College at Carlisle Barracks, PA, earning a Master's Degree in Strategic Studies. Prior to his current assignment Col Hunt was the Commander of both the 175th Maintenance Group and 175th Operations Group, 175th Wing, Maryland Air National Guard.

In his civilian capacity, Col Hunt is a pilot with a major airline. He has more than 4,000 military flying hours, including over 1000 A-10 combat hours.
